9 YEARS OF HELPING PET FAMILIES

Since 2014, our **Kibble Kitchen & Beyond** program has provided pet food and supplies to thousands of families who needed support. We have partnerships with **Williamsburg House of Mercy** and **Grove Christian Outreach** to further our impact. This year, community need was higher than ever and this vital program helped hundreds of pets to stay in their loving homes.



OTHER OUTCOMES In 2022, a total of 1,943 animals came through Heritage Humane Society's doors. Of those, 174 pets remained in our care on December 31, 2022. The Heritage Humane Society is an open admission shelter and we take in animals in many different states of health. In addition, neonatal puppies and kittens born to mothers in stressful shelter situations face an uphill battle. Euthanasia at Heritage Humane Society is performed with kindness and dignity to relieve suffering and is part of providing humane care to animals who are suffering. In 2022, 36 animals died and 69 animals were euthanized at the Adoption Center or while in the care of our veterinary partner.
