EVENTS & VISITS

Since 2014, our Kibble Kitchen & Beyond program has helped pet families who needed financial support. This vital program helps keep pets in their loving homes and out of the shelter. In 2023, we continued our partnerships with Williamsburg House of Mercy and Grove Christian Outreach and provided pet food and supplies for thousands of dogs, cats, and small critters in our community.

Other Outcomes: In 2023, a total of 1,907 animals came through The Heritage Humane Society's doors. Of those, 160 pets remained in our care on December 31, 2023. The Heritage Humane Society is an open admission shelter and we take in animals in many different states of health. In addition, neonatal puppies and kittens born to mothers in stressful shelter situations face an uphill battle. Euthanasia at Heritage Humane Society is performed with kindness and dignity to relieve suffering and is part of providing humane care to animals who are suffering. In 2023, 33 animals died and 94 animals were euthanized at the Adoption Center or while in the care of our veterinary partners.
