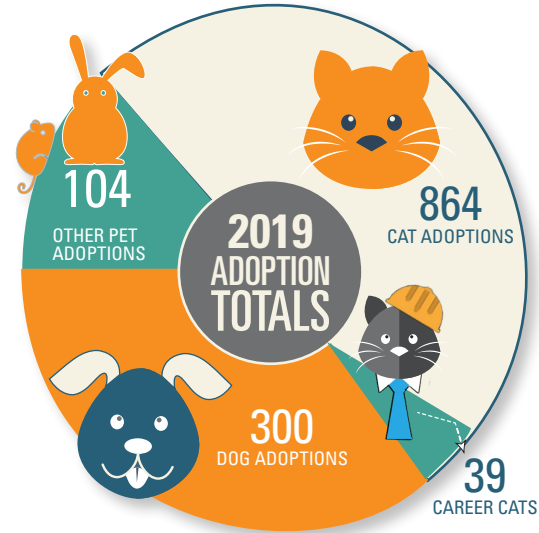


1,761 LIVE OUTCOMES

555 ANIMALS FOSTERED

The foster care program is vital to saving the lives of injured and neonatal animals who need time to heal medically.

42 EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Humane Education is an integral part of Heritage Humane Society's mission. In 2019, our staff conducted 42 humane education programs in the community. These programs included school presentations, our summer Animal Camps (with 68 campers), and various community presentations.

OTHER OUTCOMES

In 2019, a total of 1,857 animals came through Heritage Humane Society's doors. The Heritage Humane Society takes in animals from all over, in many different states of health. In addition, neonatal puppies and kittens born to mothers in stressful shelter situations face an uphill battle. Euthanasia at Heritage Humane Society is performed with kindness and dignity to relieve suffering and is part of providing humane care to animals who are suffering. In 2019: 20 animals died and 76 animals were euthanized at the Adoption Center or while in the care of our veterinary partners. Additionally, 170 pets remained in our care on December 31, 2019.
