#### TOURNAMENT FORMAT

##### Captain's Choice (Scramble)

White Tees: Male 64 & Under

Gold Tees: Male 65 & Over and all Females

All players tee off from their designated tee. One tee shot is selected. Team members hit their next shot from a position within one club length, within the same medium (fairway, rough, bunker, etc.), and no closer to the hole, from the selected shot. On the green, remain within one putter head length of the selected putt and no closer to the hole. This format will continue until the ball is holed. Hole all putts! The team score for the hole should be recorded on the provided scorecard. If the team is a threesome, one player on each hole will hit two shots for that hole, not in succession; i.e. hole 1 (Bob, Sarah, Bill, Bob). The player designated to hit two balls will rotate for the entire round. There is no minimum drive requirement for team members.

#### RULES OF PLAY

USGA rules govern all play except as modified by local rules for this tournament.

#### SCORING

A team score will be determined for each hole. **The maximum score is a double bogey.** If that score is reached, the team will proceed to the next hole. The total team score for the round will be used to determine the winners. First and Second place prizes will be awarded for each course for the Men's/Mixed division. First place prizes will be awarded for the Women's division on the Plantation Course. And new this year, first place prizes will be awarded for the High School division on the Plantation Course. Please turn in your team scorecard at the reception in the James Landing Grill.



## TIE BREAKERS

In the event of any tie, the USGA recommended method will be used (back 9 total, last 6, last 3, and if still needed the last hole).

## COURSE CARE AND ETIQUETTE

Course etiquette, as defined by USGA guidelines, will be in effect during play.

### In addition:

- Please rake bunkers, repair ball marks, and repair divots with sand.
- Use cart paths where provided. Return carts to paths at the directional signs in the fairways. Carts must remain on paths around greens.
- Appropriate golf attire is required at all times.

## PACE OF PLAY

All players are requested to play without delay in accordance with USGA guidelines. The standard time to complete a round on the course with the 90-degree rule in effect is four hours and twenty minutes. If your team feels they are falling behind, please pick up your pace. All players participating in the tournament will appreciate your individual efforts to finish your round in a reasonable amount of time.

## INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

Play will be suspended if inclement weather creates a dangerous situation for any player or the pace of play is severely impeded. One prolonged horn blast will be sounded to stop play and return to the clubhouse immediately. Players should mark the position of their ball in the event play is resumed. If possible, play will resume when the weather improves and there is time to complete play before darkness. Two short blasts will be sounded to resume play.

In the event that play cannot be resumed, a determination will be made regarding whether a sufficient number of like holes have been played by all teams to permit scoring the round to determine the winners. If play is stopped and winners cannot be determined, the tournament will be canceled. Due to fixed tournament costs, we cannot offer refunds.
